





AND NOW A NOTE FROM THE ART WORLD

By the early 1980s, artist Arman – born Armand Fernandez – had developed a signature style of large public sculptures, typically made from discarded items arranged in repeating patterns.

Arman had conceived the “Hope for Peace” monument – which embedded military vehicles and hardware in a concrete column – sometime in the early 1970s, but it was an idea that proved difficult to sell. Somewhat easier was the idea of embedding a stack of automobiles in a **60-foot-tall concrete column**; the Cartier Foundation for Contemporary Art, then located in France’s Jouy-en-Josas commune, agreed to let Arman install his sculpture on the grounds of the Château de Montcel.

‘The main characters of his works were objects that he looked for in the garbage,’ Helena Pereira wrote for *Daily Art Magazine*.

According to Pereira, Arman put some thought behind the cars he’d use in the sculpture, spending time in the area to document the cars he’d typically see in traffic there. He then sourced 60 of the same cars from a local junkyard – among them, a Honda S800 coupe, a Citroen DS21, a Citroën Traction Avant, a Mini, a smattering of Fiats and Renaults and Peugeots, and even a 1963 Buick – and had them repainted in bright colors before stacking and embedding them in 40,000 pounds of concrete. Unlike Wolf Vostell with “Concrete Traffic,” Arman wanted to leave the cars at least partially exposed, in part to directly convey that the once functional cars would now never be able to serve that function, and in part to encourage their decay over time, until all that remains of them are their impressions in the concrete.



Is \$170k too much for a Corvette, even if it is a world-beating hypercar?



It's safe to say that no car in recent history has been more hyped up and talked about than the forthcoming C8 Corvette. But that's what happens when you're allegedly taking an American icon and changing the entire drivetrain layout. Thus, we've been awash with more rumors and conjecture than usual in regards to Chevy's radical new Corvette. The latest of which popped up right here at *Corvette Forum* recently. And it's safe to say that you probably won't like it.

"\$169,900 is a go," said Zerv02. "If you're in the under 100k camp, you will be disappointed. Let the madness ensue."

Now, if you're a regular around these parts, you already know that this is the same member who allegedly saw the C8 Corvette interior with his own eyes. Then, he shared a sketch and some additional info about it with us. This claim, however, is more than a little shocking. Especially for those who believe the Corvette will continue its position as a value-priced supercar.

"This will be a global car. An American GT to compete/rival the likes of Porsche, McLaren, the Italians, etc.."

In that regard, a high price makes a little more sense. If Chevy wants to build a halo car similar to the Ford GT, they could certainly do so and charge a hefty premium. In limited numbers, it would most certainly sell out, as the GT did with no issue.
